Legislation 2013-2014 shows Fran Millar Voted yes or Voted No. Usually Yes.

Some good Bills, Some bad Bills (BAD Bills shown here). Some became Law, some didn't. Same order as on the website.

HB 34 INCOME TAX–Income tax credit for clean energy, crony capitalism, Picks winners & losers. Voted Yes. Senate Reconsider

HB 50 CENTRAL & MARKET CONTROL–Mandatory nurse reporting on other nurses Help Big Brother – Spy on each other. No Vote. Senate Voted No.

HB 59 CENTRAL CONTROL–require Licensed companies utilize alarm verification, Should be local government regulation. Voted Yes. Deal Signed

HB 178 MARKETS CONTROL–Regulates Pain clinics, licenses practitioners. Big Government knows best. Voted Yes. Deal Signed

HB 208 CENTRAL & MARKET CONTROL–Require nursing homes offer flu vaccine. Voted Yes. Deal Signed

HB 226 CENTRAL & MARKET CONTROL–Regulates tire disposal. Voted Yes. Deal Signed

HB 296 FEDERAL CONTROL & INCOME TAX–Comply fed income tax, Discriminates between vehicles. No Vote. Senate Tabled.

HB 315 CENTRAL & MARKET CONTROL –Requires nurses to obtain 30 hours continuing education & renew license every 2 years. Voted Yes. Deal Signed

HB 318 MARKET CONTROL & TAXES–Seed Capital Funded by taxpayers. Voted No. Deal Signed

HB 350 MARKET CONTROL– Government rules for hiring in certain facilities. Voted Yes. Deal Signed

HB 354 CENTRAL & MARKET CONTROL–Rules for Early Care and Learning, Department. Voted Yes. Deal Signed

HB 487 CENTRAL & MARKET CONTROL, PROPERTY–Operate gambling machines on private property "a privilege and not a right" Government will tell you what values to have. Voted yes. Deal Signed

SB 11 MORE GOVERNMENT – Georgia Geospatial Advisory Council – Voted Yes. Deal Vetoed

SB 24 FEDERAL CONTROL, TAX INCREASE–Hospital Bed Tax to obtain Fed Medicaid funds. Tax the sick to get even more from the Fed Govt. Voted Yes. Deal Signed

SB 66 NATURAL RIGHT– Contempt penalties without due Process Increase, Increase police state. Voted Yes. Deal Signed.

SB 81 NATURAL RIGHT to Property–Regulates picking Ginseng on Private Property. Voted Yes. Deal Signed

SB 97 MARKET INTERFERENCE–Creates Beef Commission, An unhealthy Public-Private Partnership for which there was no need. Voted Yes. Deal Signed.

SB 116 NATURAL RIGHT–Mistakes happen, increase penalty for unintentional Homicide by Vehicle, Police state – make somebody responsible – regardless. No Vote. No House Vote.

SB 135 NATURAL RIGHT of PRIVACY–Check DNA on person arrested but not convicted, Police state. No Vote. No House Vote.

SB 139 MARKETS–Collection of Closing fee, Crony Capitalism, should not need government to do this. No Vote. Deal Signed.

SB 212 CENTRAL CONTROL–Local School board required to provide for instruction in CP resuscitation. No Vote. Deal Signed.

SB 224 SOCIALISM - Creates a GA Venture Capital Fund – Governments owning stock is PURE Socialism. No Vote. No House Vote.

Lots of Deregulation needed

Letter to the editor: 'Here in Dunwoody, we play insider political baseball'

To the editor:

At the recent legislative forum, our state legislators Fran Millar and Tom Taylor revealed they favor adding a section to the Dunwoody city charter that eliminates the opportunity for a city-wide vote to fund the taking over of fire services from DeKalb County – they want the Dunwoody City Council alone to make this decision – only four votes necessary. Their feeble explanations to justify this charter change were complete rubbish.

Millar and Taylor mostly base their erroneous explanations on line items and categories on a tax bill – an irrelevant document. The only document that matters is the language in the current charter itself – our constitution – and there is no provision in the current charter that exempts fire service funding from the overall 3.04 millage rate cap that requires a city-wide vote to exceed under Section 1.03 (37).

Next time you see Millar and Taylor, ask them to show you where in the current city charter fire service funding is exempt from this 3.04 millage rate cap – they can't because it does not exist. Millar also tried to slough it off as a difference of opinion – a statement with no basis in fact.

Let's face it – here in Dunwoody, we play insider political baseball. Here is how the game is played. Millar may want a fire house closer to his home so he appoints his neighbor to the Charter Commission. Not satisfied with two years of incompetence including the ChatComm fiasco, the mayor and Dunwoody City Council want even more power and authority – so the mayor appoints his neighbor to the Charter Commission and the Dunwoody City Council appoints someone to do their bidding.

These three individuals are enough to carry a very controversial 3 – 2 vote to recommend this fire service funding change to the city charter – despite almost unanimous citizen opposition at many Charter Commission meetings last year – all from citizens who simply want the opportunity to have a city-wide vote for the funding of taking over of fire services.

Dunwoody taxpayers are the patsy in this political inside baseball game better known as cronyism – we pay to play it.

Right now the citizens are down 3 – 2 to the politicians. However, we intend to explain these and other things at the state Legislature and in the meantime look under the table for a clearer view of other factors that may be involved. Stay tuned. The game score may soon change.
